CREDIT RECOVERY

Credit Recovery. Students who fail high school courses shall be provided with an opportunity to recover credit for such failed courses. Researched-based successful credit recovery programs that require students to successfully demonstrate mastery of content rather than repeat an entire course shall be made available to allow students to recover credit for failed high school courses.

There are three different ways to achieve credit for failed courses. They are:

- 1. Apex. The student enrolls in the computerized system and retakes the course that was failed. The highest grade that can be derived from Apex is a "D". It is upon the discretion of the counselors and principal who can enroll into Apex courses. A student can enroll in Apex at any grade level.
- 2. Retaking of the course failed. Students can retake the course that was failed. The F will stay on their grade report from the first time the student took the course. A student can retake a course at any grade level.
- 3. Option 2. The student will test in the areas of the course that they failed. The scores on the test have grade level equivalence. Only seniors can enroll for Option 2.
