- Provide a PINC (Parent Involvement Network Coordinator).
- Meet with families as necessary.
- Provide family involvement sessions.

Students at RES will:

- Do their best work.
- Do their homework every day.
- Ask for help when needed.
- Follow the school wide behavior expectations.
- Share information from planners/folders with family.
- Read for at least 15 minutes daily.



Romney Elementary Families

RES families can support learning at home in the following ways:

- Promoting good attendance.
- Sending your child on time with adequate rest.
- Checking folders/planners for daily information about assignments and progress.
- Communicating with teachers through folders/planners/phone calls/e-mail.
