

HOME SCHOOL INSTRUCTION – GRADUATION CREDITS

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1. High School Credit. Unless and until the West Virginia Board of Education permits high school credit to be awarded to students who receive instruction in the home instruction environment, under the provisions of Section 5.6.h. of Policy 2510 (Alternative Means to Earn High School Credit), Hampshire County Schools shall not award high school credit for instruction received in the home school environment. In the event the West Virginia Board of Education determines that any third party program, provided in the home school environment, is aligned with West Virginia content standards and objectives and permits county boards of education to award high school credit for the successful completion of courses offered through such third party programs, Hampshire County Schools shall award high school credit in conformance with courses approved by the West Virginia Board of Education.
2. Grades. Any high school credit for courses that may be awarded in accordance with the terms of this policy shall not be assigned a letter grade. Students who may be awarded high school credit in accordance with the terms of this policy shall not be eligible for graduation honors.
3. Eligibility. Any student transitioning from homeschool to public school who has NEVER been enrolled in public school in grades 6-12 would enroll being immediately eligible. Any student transitioning from homeschool to public school who HAS been enrolled in public school grades 6-12 would enroll being ineligible until their 9 weeks GPA has been established.
4. Schedule Review. This policy shall be reviewed in accordance with the Policy Review Schedule.
